Spending Plans

Our school vision describes our approach to supporting children and this is reflected in the spending of pupil premium funding. Jesus takes responsibility for being a 'change maker'. The parable of the Sower emphasises the individual choices people have - 'may those with ears listen'. We believe that given the right support, children will feel empowered to strive to be the best they can be and work hard to make our world a better place. Some children require additional support in class to make sure they reach their potential academically whilst other children need motivating with improved opportunities in the arts, sport. Improved access to cultural enrichment can be a powerful motivator.

Impact Statement

Our spending plans in the year 2020/21 have been impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic. We have had to change how we spend out pupil premium money and we have had to change how we measure the impact. The following expenditure could not be made:

School Journey - trip to Bude

Provision of clubs

Music Lessons

End of Key Stage tests have also been cancelled which have inhibited our usual method of measuring impact.

Due to the pandemic, we redirected our funding to pay for additional staff to tutor children remotely and to support the children in class when they were able to return to school. We also funded the Terapia programme to support children's mental health. The terapia programme costs £1000 in the first year with increasing costs in year 2 and 3. This provides individual therapists for pupils struggling to cope with the demands placed on them in these unprecedented times.

Feedback from staff and parents showed that 90% of children on pupil premium demonstrated good engagement with remote learning during the school closure.
