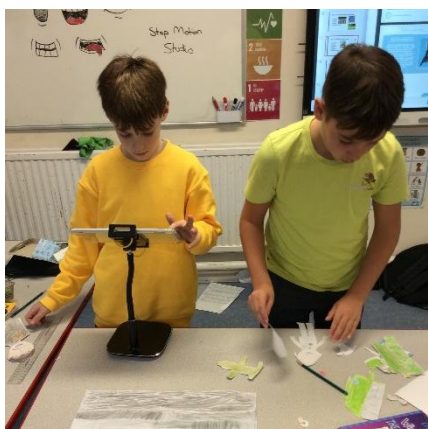
YEAR 5 ANIMATION WORKSHOP

This week, I would like to share some final tips on how to help your children find their brave. It can be difficult to step back and watch your children struggle to master a new skill. However, by jumping in too early, we can inadvertently send a message to our children that we don't believe they can do it. Instead, try to let children try to problem-solve on their own, while letting them know that you are available should they need or want help. If they do ask for help, try problem-solving with them first to see if you can support them in their learning process.

Kids will feel more motivated to try new things if they feel your confidence in being able to problem solve, knowing that you are also there to help them if they need it. They will also feel more motivated if, in these moments, you are praising and celebrating their efforts rather than their accomplishments. This does not mean you don't acknowledge their accomplishments, but that you focus on how they got there (or tried to get there). This helps children with their confidence and understanding that bravery is about trying new things, even when success is not guaranteed.
