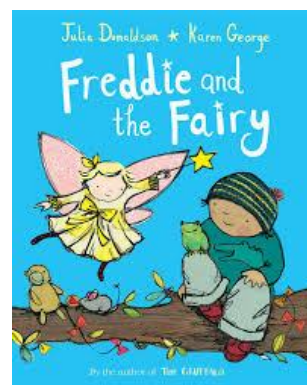


HALF TERM CAMPS
