World Happiness Report

A global report discusses the impact of social media on young people's mental health. It suggests that platforms such as Tik Tok and Instagram may be linked to lower well-being, particularly with heavy use, and that messaging apps such as WhatsApp that are built around direct social communication appear less harmful.

Researchers found that apps built around endless scrolling and filtered content can lead to increased anxiety, negative self-comparison and reduced happiness, especially with heavy use. Whereas moderate use of social media that supports social connection can have a positive impact on well-being.

This highlights the importance of balance and of encouraging young people to use social media in a mindful and purposeful way, such as communicating with friends rather than passive scrolling. We can help young people by setting healthy time limits, encouraging off-line activities and face-to-face interaction, and talking openly about on-line pressures and edited and idealised content.
