On the 24th of April, we played a football match against Alma Primary School. It was quite a tough match, considering all the chances we had during the game. May Day

Many of us can look forward to a longer break this weekend with the May Day Bank Holiday. May Day is historically International Workers Day and linked to workers' rights and working conditions. The World Health Organisation describes how a good work environment can support good mental health, providing a sense of purpose and community, giving us access to finances and a structure to our week. However long hours, and excessive workloads can pose a risk to our mental well-being. Taking breaks throughout the day, spending some time outside, and giving time to relationships and interests outside of work are important for work – life balance.

Balance is important for our children too. Hard work helps children to learn and to develop pride in their achievements and to discover what they are capable of. However, working hard needs to be balanced with rest, exercise and having some fun! Family downtime plays an important role in supporting mental health helping children to feel secure and connected and ready to take on new challenges. Children thrive when they have opportunities to learn at school, but also to rest, play and connect with the people around them.

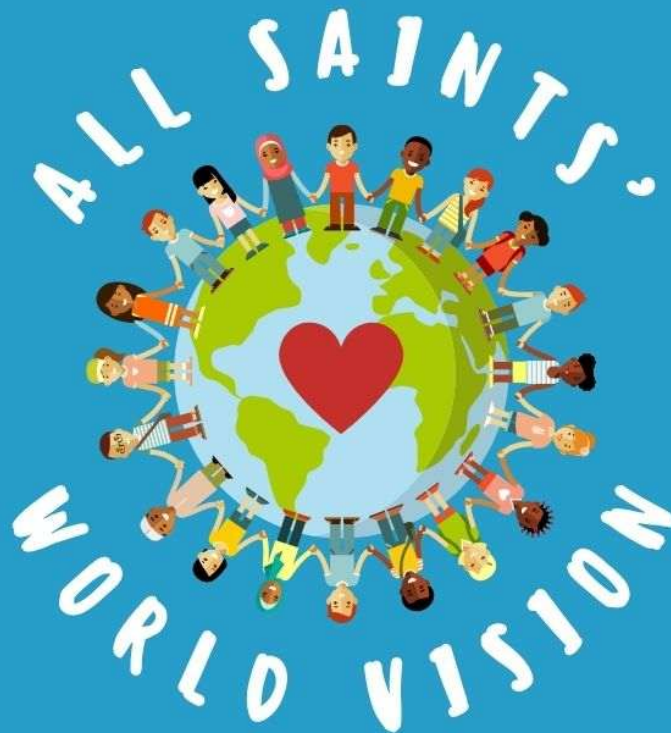
