The events:

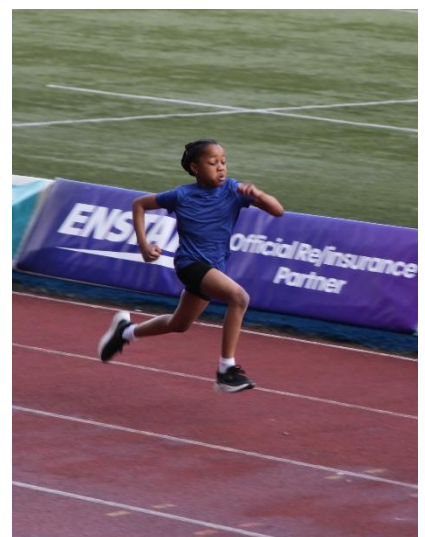
The events that were there were the 80m sprint, 400m race, relay, long jump, shot put, vortex, and lots of other stuff!

Athletics News

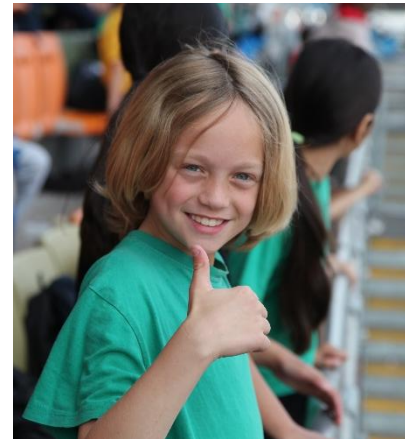

THE BIG CRICKET TOURNAMENT



On Wednesday 20th May, Years 5 and 6 from All Saints' School travelled by minibus to Oak Hill Park to compete in an action-packed mini cricket tournament from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm. Our squad featured Viraat (Captain), Ismael (Wicket-keeper), Ling Hei, Toby, Deon, Adam, Theo, and Radvin.

Match 1: All Saints vs. Wren Academy

We kicked off the tournament against Wrenn Academy. After Captain, Viraat, shook hands with their skipper (Captain), Ariaan, we won the toss and elected to field first. The match was a balanced, see-saw battle with strong moments from both sides. Wrenn Academy set a target of 243 runs, and despite a valiant effort, All Saints finished close behind on 211 runs.

In our second fixture, Barnfield School won the toss and chose to field first. Our batters faced some intense bowling (throwing) pressure, pushing hard to reach a total of 186 runs in our 8 overs. Barnfield's strong batting line-up ultimately secured them the win by 42 runs. Following a display of great sportsmanship at the handshake, the team paused to enjoy a well-deserved, hearty lunch.

Match 3: All Saints vs. King Alfred School

Refuelled and ready, we faced King Alfred School in our final match. We fielded first and enjoyed an exceptional start. Our wicket-keeper (who catches the ball behind the batter), Ismael, executed a brilliant stumping to dismiss an early batter. The bowling attack was outstanding, led by an incredible performance from our skipper, Viraat, who took three clean-bowled wickets and claimed another three from catches. King Alfred finished on 216 runs. The chase went down to the final over, with All Saints narrowly missing out by just 7 runs to finish on 209.

Although the scoreboard did not go our way, the tournament was an absolute success. The team showed fantastic determination, sharp skills, and excellent sportsmanship. Most importantly, everyone thoroughly enjoyed the day and had a brilliant time playing together.

For children it helps develop resilience and problem solving skills, giving a sense of achievement and boosting confidence.

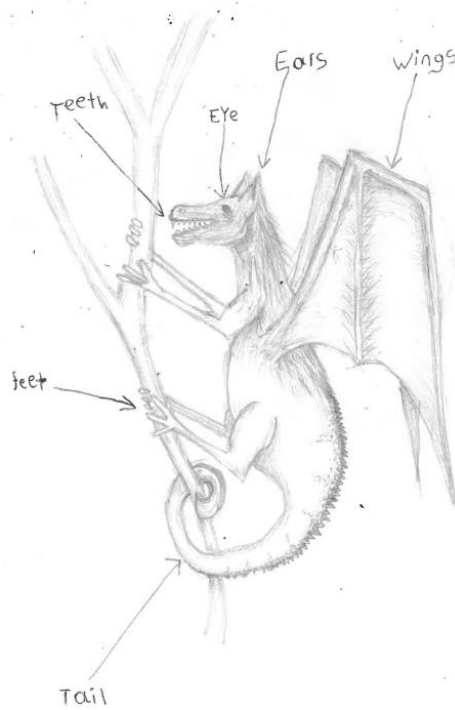
Introduction

The Bamelion (*ves pertiliō calumma parsonii*) is a rare interbreed of an old world fruit bat and a parson's chameleon. It was created in a failed science experiment which took place in Indonesia during the late 20th century.

Appearance

The Bamelion has large wings to fly for long distances and is roughly 60-70cm long, they are mostly scaly except for their head, neck and wings which are instead covered in fur. One of its most unique characteristics is its appearance which has puzzled scientists for years.

Habitat

The Bamelion lives across many tropical and subtropical climates throughout Asia, Africa and Australia; however in the spring they migrate to the rainforests of Madagascar to raise their young. This is useful because the rainforest provides warmth and protection for their delicate eggs.

Food and hunting

This marvellous creature is primarily herbivorous and its diet consists of fruit and nectar. It has robust teeth for piercing tough fruit skins. As the Bamelion is nocturnal (it sleeps during the day and finds food at night), one of its most beneficial features is its exceptional vision which enables it to find food in low-light conditions.
