On Thursday, our Year 3 class took a trip to the Verulamium Museum in St Albans as part of their topic on Romans.

In the room there were loads of artifacts around us. My group first went to see the 2000 year old mosaics, then we made our way to the 'body and bone' room. There were loads of skeletons in the old Roman tombs. There was a child tomb too and old Romans gave children coins, seashells and much more so that the child would be safe in the after life. After the bone room there was a room with waxed Roman shops and houses. The best bit was that we got to do a workshop about the Romans and we were given tunics to wear and we did trading at the market. We lost but it was fun and we had a great day. **Toby -Year 5**

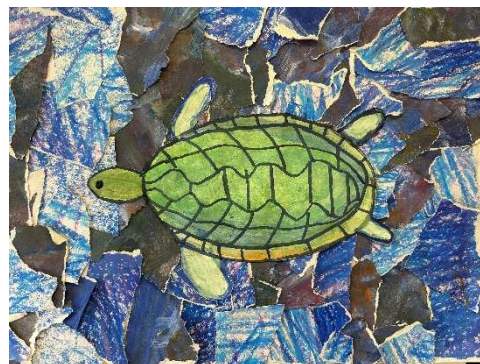
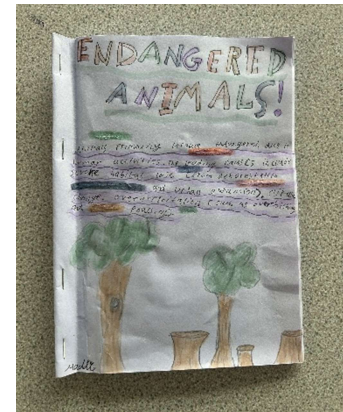
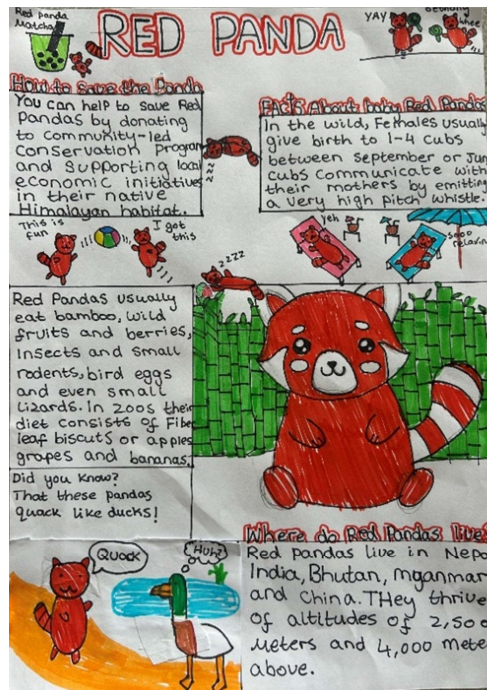
We had a really fun day. We didn't win but had some really tight games. Over all it was a 9/10 day. **Brus - Year 6**

Next week, Year 6 are going on a residential trip to the Isle of Wight, bringing an opportunity to step out of school routines and to explore new surroundings and experiences. Being away from home helps them to learn how to cope with change and manage their emotions. Team-based activities give students an opportunity to develop their communication skills and to learn about resilience and determination. Overall, they can provide a positive contribution towards their confidence and mental health.

The Year 6 trip is a milestone in school life. However, as adults - parents and school staff - we are continually supporting the development of independence and the mental wellbeing of our children, balancing emotional nurturing with the development of skills, equipping them for their next stage wherever they are at.

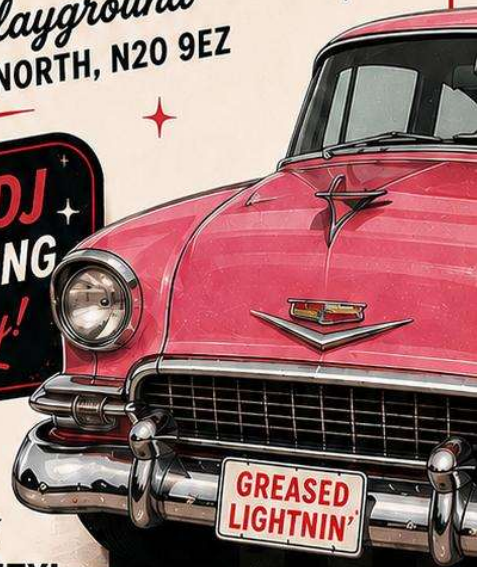

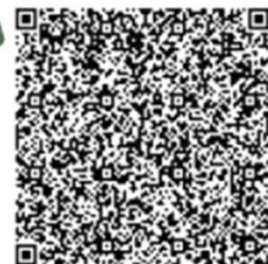
