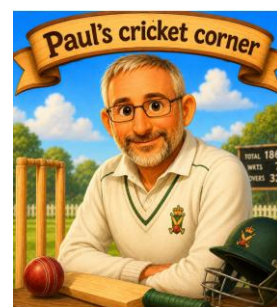
YEAR 1 GARDENERS

MR USHER'S CRICKET CORNER

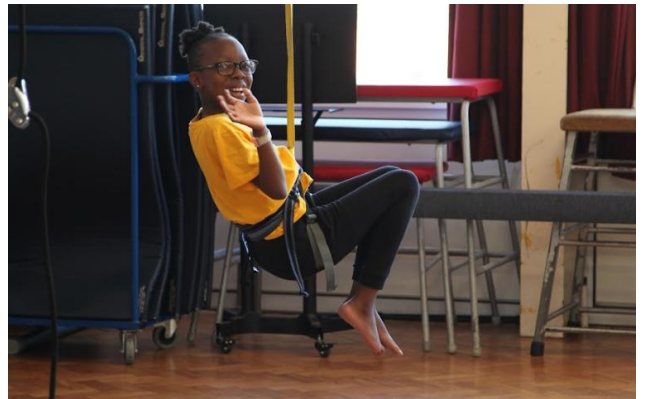

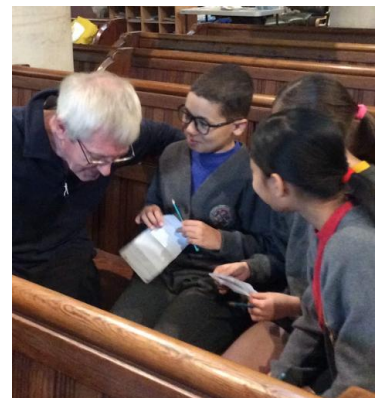

The class met representatives from the London Fire Brigade, London Underground and the Ambulance Service as part of their day.





YEAR 4 PNEUMATIC MONSTERS

As part of their science topic this term, Year 4 have been learning about pneumatics, and how pressurised air can transfer power to make mechanical motion. As part of this, they have been making 'Pneumatic Monsters', using recycling to create amazing monsters, and then the principal of pneumatics to use air pressure to make their monsters move. We were so impressed with their designs and their attention to detail to create moving monsters!



Recent debate on a social media ban for under 16s has argued both potential benefits and downsides to social media use. A ban may reduce social comparison which can contribute to anxiety and low-self-esteem. It may also reduce access to harmful content and cyberbullying, and enhance well-being with increased time spent sleeping and on physical activities and relationships.

However, it has also been argued that social media can provide friendship and support, particularly for those who are more isolated. Research does not point to a direct link between a ban and improved mental health, because well-being is influenced by many factors including family stress, loneliness and a lack of support.

Specialists suggest focusing on supporting children to develop healthy digital habits, monitoring age-appropriate use and giving guidance and having open conversations. Children need to know how to stay safe on-line and to be able to speak out if something worries them.

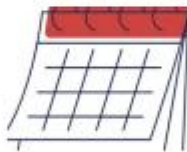

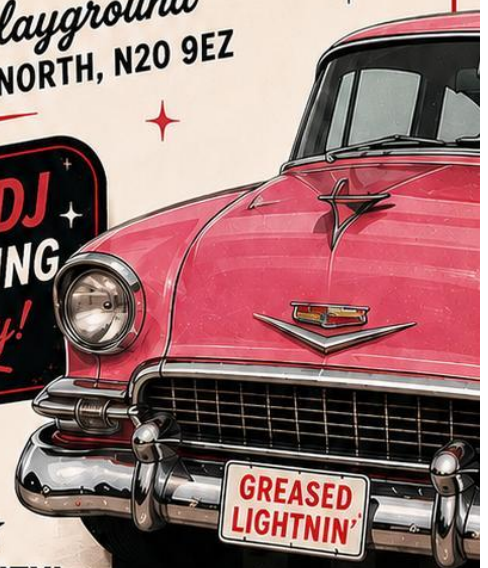
